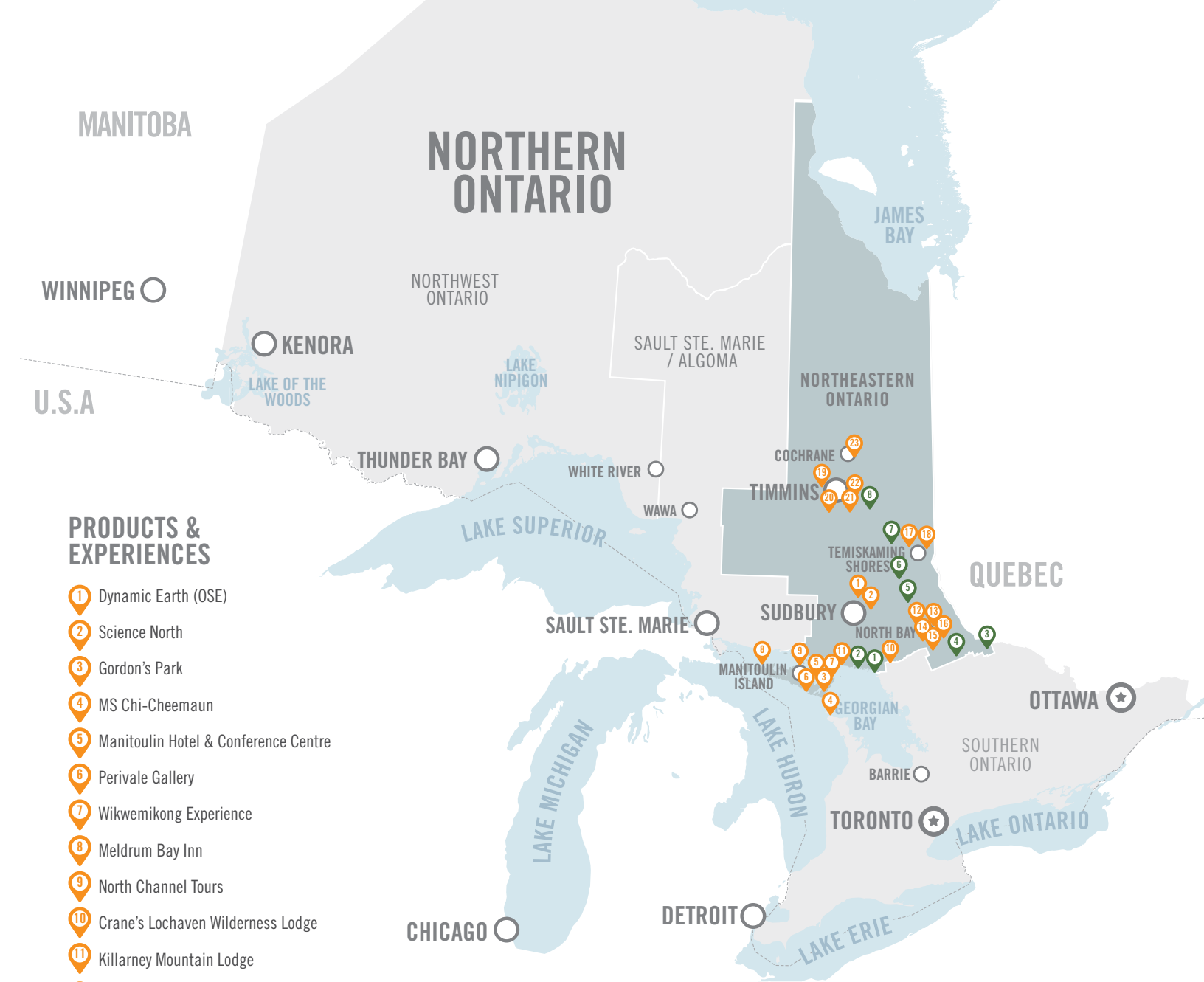

WELCOME TO SUDBURY – The city of Sudbury sits amidst small rocky mountains of the Canadian Shield, a short one-hour flight from Toronto. An ideal stop for visitors travelling to or from Manitoulin Island, Killarney and the French River areas, or points north and west. Sudbury is Northern Ontario’s largest city and an ideal four season destination to visit festivals and events throughout the year with a variety of accommodations and a range of options to suit every travel budget.

Dynamic Earth (OSE) – Dynamic Earth is one of Northern Ontario’s greatest attractions! Descend seven stories into the earth and tour underground. Explore the fascinating story of the planet’s formation and the history of mining in Sudbury in two exhibit galleries. Pan for gold, like a Yukon prospector, or relive the meteorite impact that formed the Sudbury Basin. This interactive experience offers plenty of hands-on exhibits and activities for all ages.

Science North – Visit one of Sudbury’s world-renowned attractions! Voted one of Ontario’s top indoor attractions, Science North provides family fun with a friendly hands-on approach to science education led by Bluecoats (real scientists and science communicators) who make interacting with the exhibits and live ambassador animals even more informative and fun!

The Big Nickel – is a replica of the 1951 Canadian five-cent coin, built in 1964 by local Sudburian Ted Szilva. Open to the public at no cost, visitors are invited to walk around the Big Nickel and explore the site of the Centennial Numismatic Park.

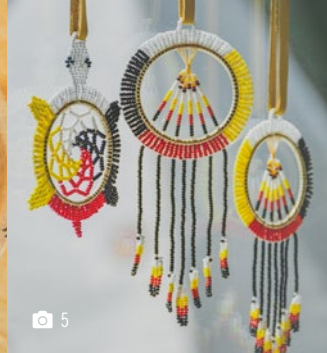
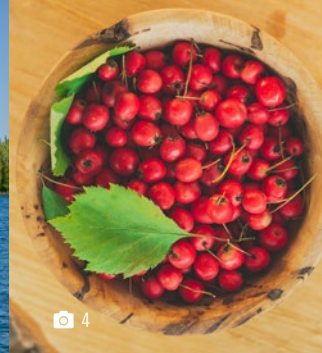
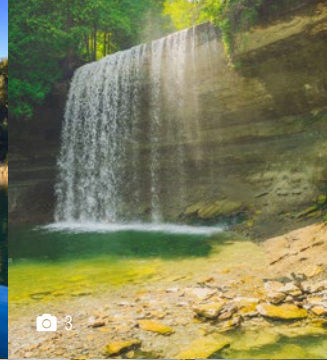

WELCOME TO MANITOULIN ISLAND –

Manitoulin Island has a laid back lifestyle making it an ideal destination for a stress-free vacation. Discover the magical Bridal Veil Falls at Kagawong, visit the museum at Mindemoya, stop at Hawberry Farms in Spring Bay for some delicious gourmet products, lounge in the sand at Providence Bay, or take in breathtaking views at 10 Mile Point. The list of things to do here is virtually endless.

Manitoulin Hotel & Conference Centre –

Wake up feeling refreshed and rejuvenated in contemporary rooms with decor reflecting the First Nations traditions. Enjoy casual fine dining with a view of the LaCloche Mountain range and the North Channel on Lake Huron. Both the outdoor patio and indoor dining area provide stunning views of the lake and mountains.

North Channel Tours – Based in Little Current on Manitoulin Island, North Channel Tours offers diverse fully inclusive full-day cruise tours showcasing the North Channel and area attractions, including a Sunset Dinner cruise, Voyage to Killarney, The Benjamin Islands and Baie Fine Fjord.

Gordon's Park – Set in the wilderness of Manitoulin Island, 13 minutes from the MS Chi-Cheemaun Ferry dock in South Baymouth, Gordon's Park is a private forested campground. This park has been designated a Dark Sky Preserve by the Royal Astronomical Society of Canada. The park features a dark sky campground where visitors can enjoy exceptional stargazing opportunities and watch the night sky come alive.

MS Chi-Cheemaun – The M.S Chi-Cheemaun is a passenger ferry capable of transporting 600 passengers and 150 vehicles, offering scenic crossings between Tobermory on the Bruce Peninsula and South Baymouth on Manitoulin Island. Sailings highlight the incredible natural beauty of Georgian Bay and its stunning shorelines. Special cruises include Sunset Dining and Stargazer's delight.

Meldrum Bay Inn & Restaurant –

This unique historic Inn is located in the quiet village of Meldrum Bay on the most western shores of Manitoulin Island. The Inn features seven charming guest rooms and a licensed dining room, with outdoor seating on the veranda.

Perivale Gallery – Visit the renowned Perivale Gallery in Spring Bay, featuring fine art by local Manitoulin artists. Located a scenic 45-minute drive from Little Current, in a beautiful rural setting.

Wikwemikong Experience – Discover Canada's only officially recognized "Unceded Territory" through the Unceded Journey historical tour and explore Northern Ontario's oldest Catholic Church. Visit the world renowned art gallery of James Simon Mishibinjima, while he shares the stories behind his pieces. Experience the traditional art of "storytelling" performed by the award winning Debajehmujig Theatre Group. Listen to the heart beat of the drum through a Dewegan Drum & Song presentation. The Unceded Experience will leave you with a greater awareness and understanding of Indigenous peoples of Turtle Island (North America).

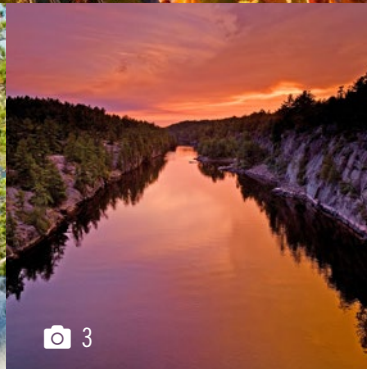

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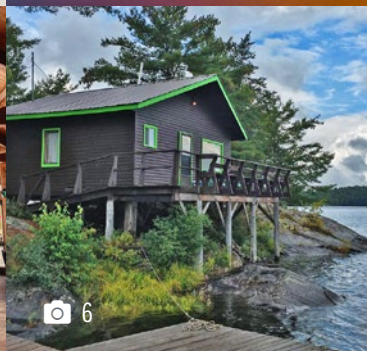
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Crane's Lochaven Wilderness Lodge –

Located on the French River, Crane's Lochaven Wilderness Lodge is a first-class operation that has been family-owned and operated since 1973. The lodge offers fully serviced, private log cabins with views of the French river. Visitors can expect top-notch service, outstanding accommodations, tantalizing cuisine and of course the incredible fishing that Ontario's French River is known for.

French River Provincial Park – In this historic wilderness park, visitors can paddle the same route that First Nations, fur traders, and Voyageurs have travelled for centuries. Learn about the natural and cultural heritage of the this historic route through the "Voices of the River" exhibit, located in the award-winning French River Visitors Centre. The exhibit features a 45-minute virtual tour down the French River with voices of past and present as guides.

Killarney Mountain Lodge – Killarney Mountain Lodge is an historic resort perched on pink granite rock of the Canadian Shield, overlooking the North Channel of Georgian Bay. Surrounded by pine forests, this iconic lodge offers every comfort in lakeside cabins and chalets, luxury suites and lodge rooms with pine and log décor. Features include casual dining, a pool, sauna, and spa, games pavilion and daily activities including canoeing, kayaking and boating.

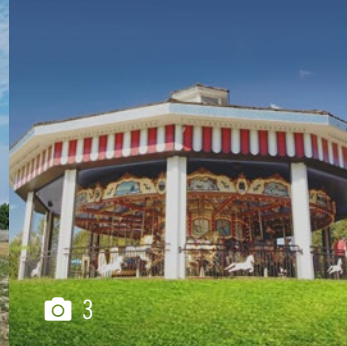
Killarney Provincial Park – This iconic 645 square kilometre wilderness landscape showcases the wild Georgian Bay Coast of pink granite; the La Cloche Mountains' white quartzite ridges and over 50 exceptionally clear, sapphire lakes set among Jack Pine hills. Killarney's majestic beauty is famous for inspiring the work of the legendary Group of Seven artists.

Explore outstanding hiking trails that pass through the scenic, rugged and rocky terrain of the La Cloche Mountain range. The George Lake campground features access to beaches, trails, and canoeing.

North Bay

Discover local history and culture.



WELCOME TO NORTH BAY – When visitors cross that invisible line that defines Northern Ontario they not only expand their horizons, but improve their worldview – even change their lives. Nestled between the picturesque shores of Lake Nipissing and Trout Lake, they will find a launchpad to adventure, culture and a lifestyle that every human secretly craves. It is the home of truly northern experiences since 1884. And North Bay is proud to share it with the world. Welcome to The Gateway to the North.

Canadian Forces Museum of Aerospace and Defence – This museum strives to inspire a deeper understanding and connection to Canada’s historical and current contributions to air defence by creating lasting connections to the history and artifacts.

Chief Commanda II Cruise – The Chief Commanda II is a 320-passenger, all aluminum twin hull vessel that cruises at speeds up to 13 knots or 25 km/h. The ship is equipped with two bars, accessible washrooms, snack bar and open-air BBQ. On-board entertainment is featured every Sunday, in July and August.

The boat features three decks. The main and second deck areas are enclosed with outside viewing areas. The top deck is open with seating and standing room, where passengers can enjoy the sunshine and spectacular scenic views of Lake Nipissing, the Manitou Islands and the French River.

North Bay Museum – The North Bay Museum is located in the historic Canadian Pacific Railway station at the corner of Oak Street and Ferguson Street in downtown North Bay. The station was built in 1903, and restored in 2004 to house the museum.

The North Bay Area Museum Society was established in 1973 as a not-for-profit organization and registered charity to preserve and celebrate the history of North Bay. The museum features regular programming as well as special exhibitions.

Heritage Railway & Carousel Company – The Heritage Railway & Carousel Company provides hours of laughter and enjoyment to 100,000 + visitors each summer who stop by to ride the beautiful carousels and miniature railway located along North Bay’s Waterfront.

Experience the magic of the lovingly restored Heritage Carousel or take a nostalgic tour on the Heritage Railway.

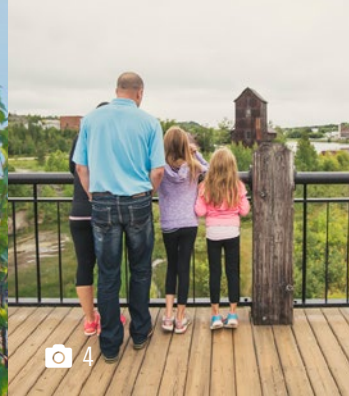
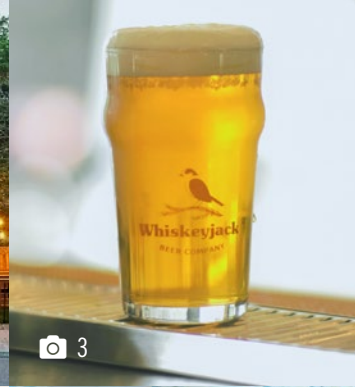
Dionne Quints Museum – On May 28, 1934, five identical girls were born in the village of Corbeil, Ontario. Their births were a miracle of its time during the difficult Depression, they were the first quintuplets known to have survived infancy. The five girls – Yvonne, Annette, Cécile, Émilie, and Marie – became a “good news” story in the challenging time, drawing worldwide attention to the area, and attracting 3 million people to “Quintland” to see and hear the girls at play. Hollywood told their story in three movies, while endorsements for commercial products became common place.

Their birthplace has been preserved for the enjoyment of current and future generations.

Temiskaming Shores

Discover a whole new Ontario!



WELCOME TO TEMISKAMING SHORES

The three former municipalities of Haileybury, New Liskeard and Dymond Township make up the City of Temiskaming Shores. Located at the head of Lake Temiskaming, the community is the service and commercial hub of a large, agricultural, forestry, and mining region.

Beautiful painted landscapes by the Group of Seven – The Group of Seven was a group of impactful Canadian landscape painters of the 1920s and 1930s. The incredible natural landscapes of the north inspired the Group of Seven artists who believed that distinct Canadian art could be created through direct connection with the outdoors.

Temiskaming Shores has five locally-inspired works of art from the Group of Seven. The local regions of Cobalt and Temagami with their tall northern pines, mining headframes and deep lakes are featured in their renowned art.

Hiking Devil's Rock – A trip north is not complete without a visit to the famous "Devil's Rock" Trail. Two paths (one easy, the other more challenging, but very scenic) lead you to a big reward: sheer cliffs and a breathtaking 180-degree vista of Lake Temiskaming. The lookout sits atop a fault cliff dating back 2.2 billion years, with a face rising 300 feet above water level.

Named Mani-doo Aja-bikong by the Manitou First Nations, it was a sacred site where offerings were made. The rock is marked with the scars of mining tunnels from the silver rush era. Some say, when viewed from the right angle, the face of the Devil can be seen in the cliffs!

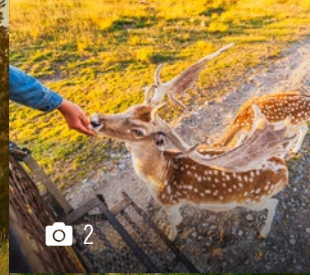

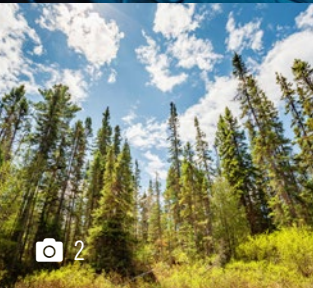

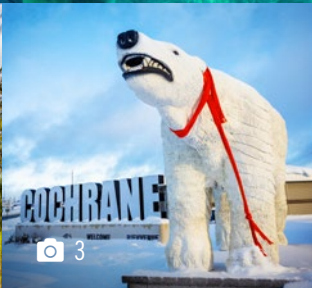

7-DAY CIRCLE TOUR 1800 KM

The Prospector Route encapsulates the significance of hardrock mining and the tourism attractions that are lined up in a relatively small, easily accessible circuit in Northeastern Ontario.

Buried deep in the vast Canadian Shield are the valuable minerals that have enriched development of mines and towns concentrated in Northeastern Ontario.

The circle tour covers a wilderness region of Boreal Forest, with vast stands of stately red and white pine forests, and where waterfalls and tumbling rapids connect lakes to resorts and campgrounds.

For an extended trip, travelers have the option to connect to the Fur Trade Route along the western segment of the Prospector Route along Hwy#11 from Cochrane to Nipigon.
